Caterina Tognon vetro contemporaneo Ca' Nova di Palazzo Treves in Corte Barozzi, San Marco 2158 30124 Venezia - Italia www.caterinatognon.com For Caterina Tognon the authors Václav Cigler and Michal Motyčka have prepared an installation titled *Prisms and Cylinders*, which presents their joint thinking on many levels, from the sensory experience of the perception of a given space to the understanding of implicit symbolic meanings and optical changes of glass sculptures in a gallery environment.

Using the words of Václav Cigler: "Glass is a magical, and in some sense spiritual, material. Optical glass, which i have been working with since the late 1950s, is a material that has been developed for technical and scientific purposes. Working with it, one can discover the secrets of the micro and macro world and see a world that is different from the world one sees with the naked eye. The optical properties of glass are therefore artistic and aesthetic means for me with the help of which I can introduce to the viewer a world featuring new shapes, lights and colors."

The exhibited works are transparent objects, elementary forms of prisms and cylinders made of optical glass. They create sensory and architectural relationships using compositions based on element sorting, change of horizon perception, and the gate composition principle. The horizon defined by the onlooker 's view changes with the change of prism bevel angles. Close to the gate, the edges of two slanting blocks converge to the center and form a narrow slot. Light transforms the shapes of objects, radiates and distorts their exact forms. Through the installation, the authors attempt to change the perception of space by the viewer.

In his artistic work, Václav Cigler has been working on glass sculptures since the late 1950s, as the first artist he discovered the potential of optical glass developed for technical and scientific purposes and began using it for the creation of works of art. He was selected to participate in major international exhibitions (1959 at the Corning Museum of Glass in Corning, USA, 1957 and 1960 at the 11th and 12th Triennial in Milan, Expo 58 in Brussels, 1964 at the Museum of Contemporary Crafts of the American Craftsmen 's Council in New York) and at the Expo 67 in Montreal, where his prism sculpture was for the first time awarded an international recognition.

Isaac Newton also experimented with the optical properties of prisms. Trying to determine the nature of light, he was able to decompose white light into a rainbow spectrum and merge it again, thereby refuting Aristotle's theory, who claimed that white light is substantially pure.

Václav Cigler and Michal Motyčka present *Prisms and Cylinders* made of optical glass that precisely formulate space and, with the help of a visual installation, develop a minimalist story of a symbolic shape - together with the physical presence of the viewer. They deal with the issue of optical displaying but also with a more serious reflection on the nature of light and the perception of colors, simply with experimenting with our senses. The objects having a seemingly simple geometric shape are enhanced by the events and actions of this light, color and shape-changing environment gallery space.

Václav Cigler

Was born on 21 April 1929 in the East-Moravian city of Vsetín. He is one of the most important authors of the artistic generation emerging in the early 1960s. In his work, he anticipated the arising concepts of then contemporary art expression (constructive tendencies, minimalism, landart, light and kinetic sculpture). He works primarily with space, glass, light and water. Between 1951 and 1957 he studied at the Academy of Arts, Architecture and Design in Prague in the studio of Josef Kaplický. In 1965 he founded, and until 1979 led, the Department of Glass in Architecture at the Academy of Fine Arts and Design in Bratislava. The work of Václav Cigler is focused on plastic objects made of cut optical glass, design and realization of lighting and jewelry, drawings, as well as projects and compositions for architecture. He has implemented a number of objects and spatial installations. He has presented his work at many solo and collective exhibitions in the Czech Republic and abroad.

His works are represented in a number of important private and public collections.

Was born on 18 March 1974 in Prague. He is an architect and art graduate from the Faculty of Architecture at the Czech Technical University in Prague and from the studio of Glass in Architecture (with Professor Marian Karel) at the Prague Academy of Arts, Architecture and Design; he completed an internship at the School of Architecture (with Professor Emil Přikryl) at the Academy of Fine Arts in Prague and received a research fellowship focusing on the field of glass at the Rhode Island School of Design in Providence, Rhode Island, USA (with Professor Bruce Chao). He is a diverse multi-disciplinary artist, and his works spans between architecture and contemporary visual art. Since 1999, he works together with Václav Cigler.
